

f. Additional Tips for Recording Videos:

- People look best with the camera being at eye level or slightly higher (don't look down at the camera)
- Person talking should take up about half of the screen (waist line to above head)
- Don't hold phone/camera. Place on stationary object if possible (to prevent camera swaying
- If taping outdoors, be aware of wind. The microphone is very sensitive to wind noise.
- If taping indoors, be aware that room with primarily hard surfaces may have a bad echo (even if you don't hear it with your own ears, the recording will pick it up).
- Don't cut bodies off below waist or mid-chest
- Don't hold the camera if possible (place on a surface)
